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perspectives on creativity explores the topic of creativity from multiple viewpoints including those of the philosopher psychologist neuroscientist therapist educator and artist the book is organized around a series of themes beginning with a consideration of the nature of creativity and how it can be cultivated with special attention to how creativity can be fostered in the classroom and work settings the second section presents qualitative studies of artists and asks what we can learn about creativity from the lives and work of these individuals such as whether there exists a relationship between creativity and mental illness the third section examines the healing power of creativity within the therapeutic milieu from the relatively more well known music and art therapy to the less familiar drama therapy the final section of the book explores the relationship between creativity and the brain and presents

studies to address whether the brains of creative individuals function differently from those of the less creative what makes this book unique is that the topic of creativity is considered in an interdisciplinary way from both theoretical and applied perspectives making it appealing to individuals from a wide variety of backgrounds

this book opens up philosophical spaces for comparative discussions of education across east and west it develops an intercultural dialogue by exploring the anglo american traditions of educational transformation and european constructions of bildung alongside east asian traditions of transformation and development comparatively little research has been done in this area and many questions concerning the commensurability of north american european and east asian pedagogies remain despite this dearth of theoretical research there is ample evidence of continued interest in self formation through various east asian practices from martial arts to health and spiritual practices e g aikido tai chi yoga mindfulness etc suggesting that these traditional practices and pedagogical relations have something important to offer despite their marginal standing in educational discourse this book will appeal to all researchers and students of comparative education studies with an interest in issues of interpretation and translation between different traditions and cultures

this book argues for a rethinking of what constitutes creativity foregrounding non economic values and practices and the often marginal and everyday spaces in which creativity takes shape

what exactly makes creative thinking so magical that somehow everyone can be creative and by implication creativity is a good thing to have to the point that this popular view is fast becoming a fashionable nonsense in this day and age of ours to put things in a historical perspective this popular view contrasts sharply with the opposing view in the older days e.g. during the enlightenment and romantic eras when people used to think that creativity was primarily for the selected few with extraordinary abilities contrary to the respective conventional wisdom in each of the two opposing eras neither of the two views is valid ours is no more so than theirs this is not to imply of course that there are only a few instances of creativity in human history or in reverse that creativity can be equally taught to everyone and for that matter that there is absolutely nothing good about creativity obviously extreme views like this are far from the truth the point in this book however is to show an alternative better way to understand the nature of creative thinking which goes beyond both convergent and divergent thinking while learning from them the current fashionable nonsense on creative thinking has tended to minimize its hidden downsides and exaggerate its overstated promises as part of a new ideology in this age of ours in addition there is nothing intrinsically good or bad about creative thinking just as there is nothing essentially good or evil about god the king the motherland or the like by analogy they have all been used and misused in accordance to the interests and powers that be over the ages if true this seminal view will fundamentally change the way that we think about the nature of imagination and intuition with its enormous implications for the future of invention and innovation in a small sense and what I originally called its post human fate in a large one
